ACADEMICS

READING

This year students will deepen their comprehension skills. Some of the biggest changes in the reading we will work on include:

Transition from learning to read to reading to learn Transition from reading a story to understanding what you are reading

Transition from picture books to a mix of picture books and chapter books

WRITING

Students will learn how to write fiction stories, poems, and research information. We will work to build our writing stamina and turn our writing into projects and presentations.

MATH

Students will become fluent in addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. In addition to these skills, we will also learn about polygons, area and perimeter, fractions, time, and graphing.

SCIENCE/S.S.

This year students will get to engage in many science experiments with electricity, magnets, life cycles, and weather! In Social studies we will learn about citizenship, communities, economics, and maps!

ABSENT?

In the event that your child has to miss school due to an illness or appointment, make sure to call the office. I will collect work your child missed so it will be ready for them to complete when they come back. This year, it could happen that your child is absent for several days. In this case, please check Google Classroom for work that can be completed at home.

HOMEWORK

Every night your child will bring home his or her Homework Folder. This folder may include special notes, reminders, graded work, etc. Please look through all the information inside the folder, empty it out, sign papers inside if needed, and return it to school the next morning!

In third grade, there **WILL NOT** be any assigned homework. Since students are working so hard during the school day, it is important for them to explore their own interests outside of school. However, I strongly **encourage** you to have your child practice nightly reading of at least 20 minutes. There will also be additional math practice pages for your child to complete if you wish.

Occasionally, students may bring home an assignment from class that needs to be completed. This most likely will be the result of not finishing the assignment in class.

In third grade, your child's reading should improve tremendously with support both in the classroom and at home. I highly suggest that each of my students read 20 minutes every night. This can include library books, magazines, newspapers, eBooks, etc. You can choose to read with your child, listen to them read, or have them read on their own. A combination of all three is best!

CRADES

Daily Work:

Your child's grades will be based on how well they perform third grade level skills. While we will complete a lot of work in third grade, only a few items will be graded and recorded. The majority of your child's work will be used for me to guide my instruction to meet their needs. A 3 indicates your child completed and understood the assignment. A 2 indicates your child needed some help or did not understand all concepts. A 1 indicates your child struggled with the assignment.

We will also check classwork often together. These assignments will be checked by your child and will not be recorded in the grade book. These assignments will be marked with a "T" which will represent that we checked the work together and discussed.

Assessments:

Assessments will be graded and recorded for a grade on your child's report card. Assessments will be kept in your child's data notebook.

BEHAVIOR

I love to have fun in the classroom! We do many exciting projects this year but have to work hard to get there. I expect students to work hard and put forth their best effort. With increased amount of standards, students are expected to stay focused and try their best. Students are held accountable for their work and behavior. We will use Class Dojo to track behavior. Students can earn points for following classroom & school expectations and exchange these points for a reward.

There are 15 students in our class!


COMMUNICATION

CLASS DOJO

Class Dojo will be behavior communication. I will invite you to join our class and you will need to download the app. You will see your child's personal dojo. You can click on your child's dojo to view their behavior report for the day. Students earn points throughout the day when they are following class/school expectations. They can then use these points to earn rewards at the end of each week. I strongly encourage you to NOT check your child's points throughout the day. It is normal to earn and lose points as the day goes by. However, I would recommend discussing your child's END of day points. This is a good indicator of how their day went.
