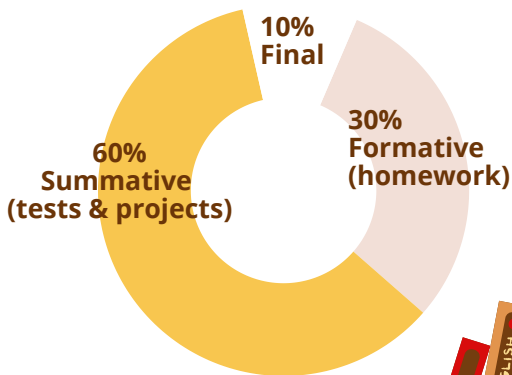

Test Correction Policy

- Students will have 5 school days from the time of the summative to come in and complete the retake.
- After 5 school days have passed, they may not correct the test at a later point.
- Students **MUST** come in to meet with the teacher prior to taking the retake to discuss/review the material for the retake.
- To correct the summative, students **MUST** have turned in all formative assessments for that unit. Only multiple choice can be corrected.
- For every corrected answer (that is correct), half point will be given back to the student per question.
- Test scores will be updated to reflect the earned half points.
 - For example, if a student missed 22 points and corrected all of their missed multiple choice questions, then their test score will be updated with 11 more points. ($22 \times 0.5 = 11$)
