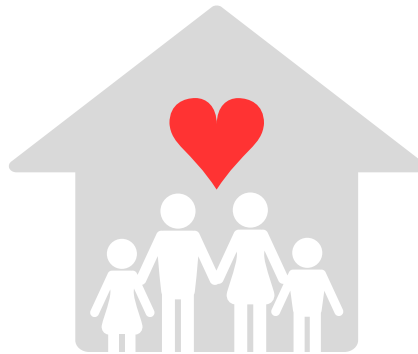

PARENTS' RIGHT-TO-KNOW

Parents will be informed of their child's level of achievement in each of the State Academic Assessments.

Parents may request information regarding professional qualifications of classroom teachers and paraprofessionals by contacting your local school or the District's Human Resource office.



Studies have found that students with involved parents are more likely to earn higher grades, attend school regularly, and graduate high school.

You can help your child succeed by helping with homework assignments, reading and talking about current events, and volunteering in school.

WHAT IS TITLE 1?

The purpose of TITLE I is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on State Academic Achievement Standards and State Academic Assessments.

TITLE I is the largest federal education program and provides financial assistance to eligible schools. The goal of TITLE I is to provide instructional services and activities to meet the needs of disadvantaged children identified as failing, or most at risk of failing the state's challenging performance standards.

TITLE I will provide your child with extra educational assistance beyond the regular classroom.

WHAT DOES TITLE 1 MEAN TO PARENTS?

TITLE I will provide opportunities for parent involvement, including family literacy and parenting skills. Materials and training will be offered to assist parents in working with their children to increase academic achievement.

It is the intention of JC Schools to provide opportunities for participation of parents with limited English proficiency, disabilities, and parents of migratory children. If special translation is needed, please contact your principal.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT/ SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES

Parent Involvement is an important aspect of TITLE I. As a parent, you can influence your child's success in school. We encourage you to be actively involved in your child's education and assist in your child's learning. As parents, you are partners in your child's education. Serve as a role model; show your child that you support his/her education.
