AP Exam Information

- Exams are 3-4 hours in length and are offered on a nationally standardized date and time.
- 2021 Exam Schedule: May 3-7, 10-14
- Cost: \$98 per exam (estimate)
- Low income students may be eligible for AP fee reductions (AP only, not for Dual Enroll)
 - Visit the counseling office to check eligibility
- Registration is available from September 14th-November 9
- Late Fee- \$40

Dual Credit Requirements

- A required 3.0 cumulative GPA at the time of enrollment. If a student has less than a 3.0, they must have a signed letter from their parents and school administration. 9th grade students must have a 3.0 and score in the 90th percentile on the ACT (33 composite).
- Lincoln University requires students to pass the math placement test, ACT math subscore of 22, or instructor in order to enroll in College Algebra. 10th grade students enrolling in Calc AB must have a sub score of 30 or above or a math placement score at 48 or above.
- Any 9th grade students wishing to enroll in Dual Enrollment classes must have a 3.0 GPA, score in the 90th percentile on the ACT, and have a signed letter of recommendation from both the school and the parents/guardians.
