MISSOURI S & T- CHANCELLOR’S SCHOLARSHIP

The Chancellor’s Scholarship is a \$12,000 scholarship for Missouri residents who will graduate high school in 2019. Recipients must have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.75 or rank in the upper 10 percent of their high school class after six semesters. Students must take the ACT or SAT by October 27, 2018, and have a score of 31 or higher on the ACT or CR+M of 1390 on the SAT. Visit sfa.mst.edu/chancellors for more information.
