Frequently Asked Questions

Will I have homework?

YES! Homework will be assigned most days to help students master the priority skills that are being taught. Just as the athlete must practice for the big event, students are also expected to practice the topics we study in class to help them be successful. All homework will be turned in at the beginning of class the following day. Homework is expected to be neat and complete. Homework is two points and it not graded for accuracy, as to not penalize students for learning. Answer keys will be posted for the homework, so late homework will not be accepted.

What do I do if I'm absent?

When a student is absent, all missed work must be completed. Students get one day for everyday absent to turn in missed work. Upon return from an absence, the student must take the initiative to collect any missing work.

How can I be prepared?

Make sure you know your basic facts and practice adding to and subtracting from 100 without using your fingers. Knowing your multiplication facts up through 12 without having to draw or count up will be extremely beneficial to being able to solve longer problems more efficiently and successfully. Using your fingers will slow you down and allow for more calculation errors. Also, practice basic fraction skills so you can recognize $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{3}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$. Cooking is a great way to help this visualization.

How do I know what my grade is?

All graded work is recorded in campus portal. All graded paper work will also be kept in the math binder in the classroom until the conclusion of the unit.

How will I be graded?

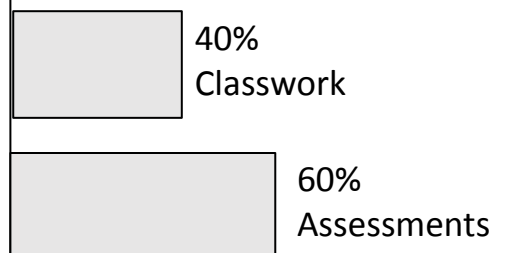

Students are given a target tracker at the beginning of each unit to help them track what skills will be on the test. They will complete practice in class and as homework prior to taking target tickets which focus on one skill. Target tickets may be retaken if a student can show they have completed practice to show they better understand a topic. At the end of each unit, students will take a summative test.
