We hope that each of you have been able to enjoy time with your children this summer! If you receive home visits, please expect a phone call, text, or email from your parent educator by August 20 to set up your first visit of the year together. If your parent educator has not been able to reach you to set a visit by the beginning of September, they will assume that you are no longer interested in participating in the program and will exit your family so that we can begin visiting with one of the many families on our waiting list. You may also let your parent educator know if you are willing to give your visit spot to someone else, and we can then move your family to our PAT Lite program so you can continue to access our other services.

If you have not attended a group connection event or visited our Drop in and Play Center we hope you will take advantage of these opportunities.

If you are not currently receiving home visits please remember that your child is also eligible for a developmental screening once per school year from age 3 months to 5 years (more on these services throughout the newsletter).

If you have friends with young children who reside in the Jefferson City Public Schools attendance boundaries, please let them know that they can take advantage of our screening services even if they are not enrolled in Parents as Teachers. This is a great opportunity to consult with a parent educator as well.

Thank you to each of you who provided feedback on our PAT program by filling out the Survey Monkey survey or a paper survey and returning it to our office. We use this information to help inform how we deliver our services, and use them (along with the forms you filled out if you attended a group connection last year) to choose topics/themes for this year's events. You picked some great ones!

If you would like to provide more input into our program, we are looking for a couple of parents to join our PAT Advisory Committee. What's Going on With PAT?

You've asked and we listened...there are new ways to keep in touch with PAT. Check them out and decide which work best for your family.

MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD IS ON TRACK WITH A DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING

Parents as Teachers offers FREE screening once per school year for all children in the school district ages 3 months to 5 years of age. Developmental screenings offer parents a quick and effective way to look at how their child is learning and growing in the areas of health, vision, hearing, communication, physical development, problem-solving, and social/emotional development.

There are many benefits to screening, including: You will see how your child is growing, you will learn what is expected next in your child's development, and delays in developmental or physical problems can be identified early. This could reduce a child's need for special help when he is in school.

Your child's development progresses in a pattern. Each new skill builds on earlier and less complicated skills. This pattern depends on your child's age, health, and how much practice he has had. If your child is weak in any area, we can give you suggestions to help build those skills. We can also give you names of places to go for further testing if the screening identifies any concerns.

KIDSIGHT VISION SCREENING

In addition to the functional vision and acuity screenings offered by our parent educators during home visits or at one of our screening events, we are pleased to partner with KidSight to offer screening for amblyopia ("lazy eye") and other concerns, available for children six months of age and older.

Using a Plusoptix photoscreening device, trained technicians quickly and noninvasively take a picture of each child's eyes and the device produces an immediate "pass" or "refer" result.

ALL families are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity. No appointment is necessary for this screening. KidSight will conduct first-come, first-serve vision screenings from 4:30-6:30 p.m. at the Southwest Early Childhood Center (812 St. Mary's Blvd.) on the following dates:

September 29 January 24 November 29 March 30

Come Visit the Drop in and Play Center

To help keep the Drop in and Play center clean and safe for all families who wish to use it, please keep the following rules in mind:

- Please sign in when you arrive and out when you leave, so we know who is here.
- Snacks should be consumed outside. With the exception of nursing or bottle feeding babies, no food or drink is allowed in the center.
- Place any toys that your child has put in his or her mouth in the marked tub so it can be sanitized.
- Allow time for cleaning up.
 Putting toys away in their designated spot is part of the play process. Shelves and tubs are labeled to help facilitate this.

The Drop in and Play center (DIP) is a fun place for parents, guardians, or grandparents who are enrolled in the Parents as Teachers program (including PAT Lite and the waiting list) to play with their children. It provides the opportunity to use toys and materials that children may not get to use at home in a different setting, and there is often the opportunity to interact with other children. Toys are washed and disinfected regularly to help stop the spread of germs.

The Drop in and Play center is located across the hall from the main office of the Southwest Early Childhood Center (on the side of the building that has the sign in the grass out front). For security purposes, building entrances have secured vestibules, which means you can enter the first set of doors and will then need to be let into the building.

A large bulletin board featuring local familyfriendly events is located inside the Drop in and Play Center, and we will be enlarging our resource information center as well to include brochures and flyers.

The Drop in and Play center will be open from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. on days that school is in session, beginning August 18. The center will be closed the following days: September 5, October 7 & 28, November 23-25, December 22 at noon-January 2, January 16, February 20, March 3 & 20-24, and April 14. The last day the Drop in and Play center will be open for this school year will be May 12.

In addition to day hours, the Drop in and Play center will be open the following evenings from 4-7 p.m.: September 12 & 29, October 11, November 29, January 24, February 23, March 30, and April 24.



WHAT IS A GROUP CONNECTION?

Group Connections offer opportunities for parents to learn about child development.

Sometimes this means bringing in special speakers on different topics for parents to listen to. It may mean special family events such as health or resource fairs, or that we'd love to have you stop by the PAT booth at events out and about in the community. Most often, group connections are times for parents and children to enjoy playing together so that parents can learn by observing their own and other children.

During most hour-long group connection activities you can expect to gather in a large group for an opening book or activity, and information from the parent educators leading the event related to the topic. If you come late to the event, you may miss this important information. Most of the event will be spent in hands-on learning activities with your child. There will be several stations set up and you may choose to do all or some of the activities, based on your child's development and interest. Closing will generally be another book or large group activity.

Some events are "come and go" events during which you can come at any time and leave when you are ready. These are designated in the group connection description.

We ask families that attend to fill out a feedback form about the experience to help us plan future events, and you will go home with a book or other prize.

Once again we have chosen the topics /themes of this year's group connections based on your suggestions, and all events are suitable for infants-age 5.

Events will be held in the gym at the Southwest Early Childhood Center (812 St. Mary's Blvd, JCMO), unless otherwise noted. For evening or Saturday events, you will need to enter the front doors on the side of the building that has the sign in the grass out
