language of infants), respond back to your baby with a coo. This will help you discover what your baby likes and this encourages early language development.

3-6 Months: "Hello Hands" Babies at this age enjoy exploring their hands and feet so take a pair of your baby's socks and cut out five holes into each sock for fingers. You can color the fingers with non-toxic material or draw shapes onto the socks. This will help your baby explore and learn about his/her colors.

3-6 Months: "Three Blocks, Two Hands" Have your baby sit on the floor or in a high chair. Give your baby two blocks and then give your baby one more. He/she will learn to drop the second block to be able to pick up the third. This will help your baby learn dexterity.

9-12 Months: "Mr. Bear" Say the following poem to your child. "Mr. Bear, Mr. Bear, Where can you be? I will find you Wait and see." Hide the bear while your baby watches and then ask your baby where the bear is. Use words such as behind, under, and inside. This activity helps with spatial relationships.

Games to Play with Toddlers (Silberg, 2011)

12-15 Months: "Color Game" Zoom two colored cars up to your child and place two pieces of colored paper (the same colors as the two cars) on the floor. For example, if you have one red car and one blue car you should use one red and one blue piece of paper. Have your child place the red car on the red paper and the blue care on the blue paper. Repeat this activity with different colors. This activity helps your child with matching and color recognition.

15-18 Months: "Junk Mail" Allow your toddler to open your junk mail and even unfold the letters. Children love to do this and this activity helps your child's language and fine motor skills as your child opens and unfolds the mail and as you talk about the pictures or print written on the mail.

18-21 Months: "The Raisin Game" Give your child some raisins in a small bowl and an empty plastic jar with a lid. Place the lid on the jar. Show your child how to put his/her raisins inside the jar. Children can spend a lot of time doing this over and over and this activity helps develop your child's fine motor skills.

21-24 Months: "Four Little Blocks" Place four blocks on the floor or table. As you put the blocks on the floor/table say: Four pretty blocks on the floor, one, two, three, four, one for mommy, one for daddy, one for doggie too, but the last block is just for you. As you say this poem, stack the blocks on top of each other. You can use the people or animals that have meaning to your family. This activity works on counting and fine motor skills.

Games to Play with Two Year Olds (Silberg, 2011)

Young Twos: "Andy Spandy" Say the poem and do the actions: Andy Spandy, sugar candy, I pop down. Andy Spandy, sugar candy, I pop up. Andy Spandy, sugar candy, I pop in. Older Twos: "Same and Different" Collect various items that come in twos around your house such as gloves,
