We also have new offerings for families who participate in our PAT Lite program or who are waiting to be assigned a parent educator for home visits. You will find that our calendar includes monthly screening events held at our center so more children ages 3 months-5 years can receive free health, hearing, vision, and developmental screenings. ## "Parenting with Conscious Discipline®" Training for Families

This past spring, the Jefferson City Public Schools' Parents as Teachers program collaborated with the JCPS Foundation to apply for a grant from the United Way of Central Missouri, and are pleased to announce that we were chosen as one of the recipients of funding. This grant will be used in part to support our Teens as Parents program through the purchase of educational materials related to pregnancy, child birth, and infant care. The balance of the funding will be used to bring Karen Hickman, a National Conscious Discipline® Certified Instructor, to Jefferson City to provide a series of free trainings for parents and providers. Karen travels nationally working with parents and educators, and is excited to partner with us as we all work together to provide the safest and healthiest environments for our children.

Karen is passionate about helping adults develop the skills necessary to transform themselves, their classrooms, and their families. Her workshops are based on Dr. Becky Bailey's Conscious Discipline®, a social-emotional intelligence program

consisting of Brain Smart® strategies for responding, rather than reacting to life events.

Children develop their self-regulation skills from the adults in their lives. In this series we will learn about the seven skills of Conscious Discipline®, so we as parents will be better equipped to be the parents we want to be.

A session on "Building Connections & Establishing Routines" (most suitable for infant/toddler age) will be offered on September 21, 2015 and April 4, 2016 (the same content each time).

A six-part series most suitable for toddlersschool age includes the following sessions:

- Brain Research & Composure (October
- Adult Assertiveness & Encouragement (November 9)
- Choices & Empathy (December 14)
- Child Assertiveness & Positive Intent (January 4)
- Consequences (February 22)
- Integrating All 7 Skills (March 21)

In order to benefit the most from the training, we ask that parents and providers attend all six sessions in the series if at all possible.

All sessions will run from 6-8 p.m. and will be held at the Southwest Early Childhood Center at 812 St. Mary's Blvd. in Jefferson



City unless registration exceeds gym capacity.

# Come Check Out the New Drop in and Play Center

To help keep the Drop in and Play Center clean and safe for all families who wish to use it, please keep the following rules in mind:

- Please sign in when you arrive and out when you leave, so we know
- Snacks should be consumed outside. With the exception of nursing or bottle feeding babies, no food or drink is allowed in the center.
- Place any toys that your child has put in his or her mouth in the marked tub so it can be sanitized.
- Allow time for cleaning up. Putting toys away in their designated spot is part of the play process. Shelves and tubs are labeled to help facilitate this.

The Drop in and Play center (DIP) is a fun place for parents, quardians, or grandparents to play with their children. It provides the opportunity to use toys and materials that children may not get to use at home in a different setting, and there is often the opportunity to interact with other children.

Toys are washed and disinfected regularly to help stop the spread of germs (we like to brag that we have the cleanest ball pit around!). This year we will be rotating toys through different centers on an approximately monthly basis, so there may be something new to check out each time you visit.

Families may enter either one of the main (front) entrances to the Southwest Early Childhood Center in order to access the Drop in and Play center, but it is closer to the side

of the building that has the sign in the grass out front. For security purposes, both entrances are now secured vestibules, which means you can enter the first set of doors and will then need to be let into the building. The Drop in and Play center has moved just across the hall from its previous location. The PAT Coordinator's office is now located within Drop in and Play, and a sign will be posted listing times she is available if you wish to visit with her or have questions.

The Drop in and Play center will be open from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. on days that school is in session from August 24 to May 13, and one evening a month from 4-7 p.m. in conjunction with our screening events. ## MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD IS ON TRACK WITH A DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING

Parents as Teachers offers FREE screening once per school year for children ages 3 months to 5 years of age. Developmental screenings offer parents a quick and effective way to look at how their child is learning and growing in the areas of health, vision, hearing, communication, physical development, problem-solving, and social/emotional development.

There are many benefits to screening, including: You will see how your child is growing, you will learn what is expected next in your child's development, and delays in developmental or physical problems can be identified early. This could reduce a child's need for special help when he is in school.

Your child's development progresses in a pattern. Each new skill builds on earlier and less complicated skills. This pattern depends on your child's age, health, and how much practice he has had. If your child is weak in any area, we can give you suggestions to help build those skills. We can also give you names of places to go for further testing if the screening identifies any concerns.

### **KidSight Vision Screening**

In addition to the functional and acuity vision screenings offered by our parent educators during home visits or at one of our screening events, we are pleased to partner with KidSight to offer screening for amblyopia ("lazy eye") and other concerns, available for children six months of age and older.

Using a Plusoptix photoscreening device trained technicians quickly and noninvasively take a picture of each child's eyes and the device produces an immediate "pass" or "refer" result.

ALL families are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity. No appointment is necessary for this screening. KidSight will conduct first-come, first-serve vision screenings at the Southwest Early Childhood Center the following dates:

# **Group Connection Events**

Group Connections offer opportunities for parents and children to come so that parents can learn by observing their own and other children. During a group connection you can expect to gather in a large group for an opening book or activity, and information from the parent educators leading the event related to the topic. Most of the event will be spent in hands-on learning activities with your child. There will be several stations set up and you may choose to do all or some of the activities, based on your child's development and interest. Closing will generally be another book or large group activity. We ask families that attend to fill out a feedback form about the experience to help us plan future events, and you will go home with a book or other prize.

Once again we have chosen the topics /themes of this year's group connections based on your suggestions. With the exception of the "Reading Your Baby's Cues," all events are suitable for infants-age 5.

# **Getting the Most out of Parents as Teachers**

It's Monday morning and your Parents as Teachers parent educator is coming to visit. What's going through your mind? Maybe you're looking forward to sharing what your baby has recently started doing or a goal you achieved. Maybe you have a question or concern to address. Hopefully, you're not thinking about canceling the visit!

Things are going through your parent educator's mind, too. He or she is thinking about you and your child! Your parent educator has planned what to discuss based on your interests and your child's development. Of course, your parent educator will bring a parent-child activity that you can enjoy with your child, often using materials you already have in your home.

You and your parent educator are partners in making the most out of your time together. Here are some things you can do to get the most out of participating in Parents as Teachers.

**Observe your child.** You see your child every day; your parent educator visits for a short time. Be ready to share what's new with your parent educator.

#### Don't worry about housekeeping.

Certainly, it's helpful to have a clean space where everyone can sit, but your parent educator won't mind if there are dishes in the sink. Relax and enjoy your personal visit.

Minimize distractions. If your pet longs for attention, take him out of the room until your visit is over. A television or radio playing in the background may make it hard for everyone to concentrate. Save chores such as laundry or dishes for after your parent educator leaves. Put your phone on mute or turn it off. You will get the most out of your time together if you give your full attention to your child and your parent educator.

Let your parent educator know your thoughts and feelings. Fully participate in the partnership. Don't be embarrassed to ask any question you might have. Share your goals for your child and the progress you're working toward achieving them. Feel free to share fears or things that worry you. Your parent educator will keep your comments confidential.

Follow up on recommendations. Your parent educator will suggest activities you can do with your child between personal visits. Have fun doing these with your child and observe his development. If you and your parent educator form a plan for

and make the necessary contacts. **Attend group connections**. Group connections can provide new information from experts, allow you to meet other families, and give you fun activities to do with your child. You get the most out of your Parents as Teachers program when you participate in all the components – personal visits, group connections, screening, and using community resources.

Thank you for being in Parents as Teachers. Our vision is that all children will learn, grow, and develop to realize their full potential. You are the most important person to make that vision come true for your child.
