We have a great year planned for the 2017-2018 PAT program year!

This summer has been a busy one for your JCPS PAT program. Even though we follow the school year calendar and break for the summer, you many have seen parent educators at events around the community. Several also took advantage of training opportunities to help them best serve you and your family, including a week-long Conscious Discipline® institute. We can't wait to bring you more Conscious Discipline® information during home visits and we have also scheduled five parent nights this school year based upon Dr. Becky Bailey's approach. If there is sufficient interest, we will offer a book study on her book Easy to Love, Difficult to Discipline.

We've also been busy with preparing for starting the school year with an expanded preschool program at the Southwest Early Childhood Center. This year we will only be serving students who were four by July 31^{st.} If your child fits this criteria and you are interested in having him/her screened to be placed on the waiting list for preschool, please talk with your parent educator or contact me at 659-2350. We will continue to serve children based on academic need, but families are no longer required to qualify for free or reduced lunch to enroll their child into our free preschool program.

Because of this expansion, we are excited to announce that we will be adding another parent educator to our team soon!

If you have been receiving home visits, your parent educator is looking forward to catching up with you. Please expect a phone call, text, or email from your parent educator soon to set up your first visit of the year together. If you are not sure that she has your correct phone number, please call the Southwest Early Childhood Center office at (573)659-3026 so we can get a hold of you. If your parent educator has not been able to reach you to set a visit by the beginning of September, we will assume that you are no longer interested in participating in the program and will exit your family so that we can begin visiting with one of the many families on our waiting list. You may also let your parent educator know if you are willing to give your visit spot to someone else, and we can then move your family to our PAT Lite program. Both families enrolled in PAT Lite and those waiting to be assigned a parent educator for home visits are eligible to attend group connections, sign their child up for a screening appointment, and use the Drop in and Play Center and we encourage you to do so. We hope to see you soon!

MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD IS ON TRACK WITH A DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING

Parents as Teachers offers FREE screening once per school year for all children in the school district ages 3 months to 5 years of age, whether or not they are enrolled in Parents as Teachers. For families who receive home visits, screening will be completed in your home by your parent educator. If your family does not receive home visits or you and your parent educator have agreed that screening at our center would be more appropriate for your child, we welcome you to sign your child up for a screening at one of our monthly events.

Developmental screenings offer parents a quick and effective way to look at how your child is learning and growing in the areas of health, vision, hearing, communication, physical development, problem-solving, and social/emotional development.

There are many benefits to screening, including: You will see how your child is growing, you will learn what is expected next in your child's development, and delays in developmental or physical problems can be identified early. This could reduce a child's need for special help when he is in school.

Your child's development progresses in a pattern. Each new skill builds on earlier and less complicated skills. This pattern depends on your child's age, health, and how much practice s/he has had. If your child is weak in any area, we can give you suggestions to help build those skills. We can also give you names of places to go for further evaluation if the screening identifies any concerns.

KIDSIGHT VISION SCREENING

In addition to the functional vision and acuity screenings offered by our parent educators during visits and at our screening events, we are pleased to partner with KidSight to offer screening for amblyopia ("lazy eye") and other concerns, available for children six months of age and older.

Using a photoscreening device, trained technicians quickly and noninvasively take a picture of each child's eyes and the device produces an immediate "pass" or "refer" result. More information about KidSight can be found at https://kid-sight.org/

ALL families are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity. No appointment is necessary for this screening. KidSight will conduct first-come, first-serve vision screenings from 4:30-6:30 p.m. at the Southwest Early Childhood Center on Monday, October 30 and Thursday, February 22.

Have Fun with Your Child in our Drop in and Play Center



The Drop in and Play center (DIP) is a fun place for parents, guardians, or grandparents who are enrolled in the Parents as Teachers program (including PAT Lite and the waiting list) to play with their children. It provides the opportunity to use toys and materials that children may not get to use at home in a different setting, and there is often the opportunity to interact with other children.

The Drop in and Play center is open from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. on days that school is in session from August 21, 2017 to May 11, 2018. It will also be open the following evenings from 4-7 p.m.: September 13, October 30, November 28,

January 8, February 22, March 22, and April 3. Dates the center is closed are listed on our PAT events calendar as well as on the Drop in and Play section of our website at http://www.jcschools.us/Page/379

For security purposes the building has a secured vestibule, which means you can enter the first set of doors and will then need to ring the doorbell and ask to be let into the building. Please use the entrance that has the marquee set sign in the grass and steps leading up to the front of the building.

As parking is along the sides and back of the building, please note that you may have a difficult time leaving in the late afternoon if you are not parked in the spots closest to the front of the building. Preschool parents often begin lining up early for pick up, starting behind the blue dumpster and wrapping around the playground.

To help keep the Drop in and Play Center clean and safe for all families who wish to use it, please keep the following rules in mind:

- Please sign in when you arrive and out when you leave, so we know who is here.
- Snacks should be consumed outside.
 With the exception of nursing or bottle feeding babies, no food or drink is allowed in the center.
- Place any toys that your child has put in his or her mouth in the marked tubs so they can be sanitized.
- Allow time for cleaning up. Putting toys away in their designated spot is part of the play process. Shelves and tubs are labeled to help facilitate this.



WHAT IS A GROUP CONNECTION?

Group Connections offer opportunities for parents to learn about child development. Sometimes this means bringing in special speakers on different topics for parents to listen to. It may mean special family events such as health or resource fairs, or that we'd love to have you stop by the PAT booth at events out and about in the community. Most often, group connections are times for parents and children to enjoy playing together so that parents can learn by observing their own and other children.

During most hour-long group connection activities you can expect to gather in a large group for an opening book or activity, and information from the parent educators leading the event related to the topic. If you come late to the event, you may miss this important information. Most of the event will be spent in hands-on learning activities with your child. There will be several stations set up and you may choose to do all or some of the activities, based on your child's development and interest. Closing will generally be another book or large group activity.

Some events are "come and go" events during which you can come at any time and leave when you are ready. These are designated in the group connection description.

We ask families that attend to fill out a feedback form about the experience to help us plan future events, and you will go home with a book or other prize.

Once again we have chosen the topics /themes of this year's group connections based on your suggestions, and all events are suitable for infants-age 5.

Events will be held in the gym at the Southwest Early Childhood Center (812 St. Mary's Blvd, JCMO), unless otherwise noted. For evening or Saturday events, you will need to enter the front doors on the side of the building that has the marquee sign in the grass out front.
