Bullying Prevention Starts Early

Bullying has been a topic of conversation in the news lately, but not always one that we think about before our children enter elementary or middle school. Perhaps we should, because there is a lot that we can do starting at birth to prevent our children from becoming either bullies or victims down the road. Because bullying is a relationship issue, how we connect and bond with our children from a young age impacts how they relate to others. How parents interact with each other as well as with their children serves as a relationship model, so let's teach them what healthy relationships look like. The short film below (How To Make A Bully from Scratch), shows the road signs that a bully is in the making. If you are interested in learning more about these road signs and what interventions can help at each age and stage of development, check out these videos for <u>0-3 years</u>, <u>3-5 years</u>, <u>5-8 years</u>, <u>8-12 years</u>, and <u>the teenage years</u>.
