Help keep your parent educator safe this winter

Personal safety is an important concern for everyone. To assist your parent educator when she comes for a home visit, please clear snow and ice from entrances to your home as well as leaving the porch light on for her.

If JCPS has a late start, releases early, or cancels school due to inclement weather, your home visit will likely be cancelled, but they are not cancelled automatically. Your parent educator will be in touch with you regarding your visit so you can decide together to keep your visit or reschedule, as road conditions may improve during the course of the day. As wintertime road conditions vary across the school district, please be in contact with your parent educator if she is scheduled to come to your home even on a day when school IS in session if road conditions where you live are treacherous.

CONSCIOUS DISCIPLINE® Power of UNITY ("We're All in This Together") and Skill of ENCOURAGEMENT

The skill of encouragement and the corresponding power of unity are founded on neuroscience research that shows us that our brains develop through meaningful social interactions. The quality (rather than just the quantity) of meaningful relationships that we have impacts our well-being and development. When children have responsibility to contribute to their families (through chores) and the community, they learn how their behavior contributes positively to the welfare of others. For parents and families, one way to help builds the protective factor of *social connections* is by giving back by volunteering and serving in one's community. When we provide social support to others, we feel happier and better about ourselves and life feels more meaningful. Everyone, including children, has unique gifts to share.

During the holiday season, there are extra opportunities to help make someone's day brighter. Many local agencies (such as <u>Samaritan Center</u>, <u>Salvation Army</u>, and <u>Hope for Christmas</u>) welcome donations of toys for families in need during this time of year, and several of the events in the calendar below encourage attendees to bring donations of various items. Families could also volunteer together to <u>ring bells for the Salvation Army</u> red kettles, visit a local nursing home, make and bring treats to a lonely neighbor, or send a letter or card to a family member or friend far away. <u>Click here</u> for a printable version of the calendar below with lots of other ideas of ways for children to be compassionate, <u>or here</u> for suggestions for adults. If your family is visited by an elf during this season, <u>this post</u> shows you how you could add a Conscious Discipline twist to encourage kindness and helpfulness.

Even our everyday interactions with our children provide us with plenty of moments to notice when they are offering kindness, caring, or helpfulness to one another. When we make the shift to focusing on the positives instead of the things we see them doing "wrong," we are teaching them how to be helpful. (Remember the power of attention, which tells us that what we focus on, we get more of, whether that is love, judgment, criticism, or compassion). When we give children specific feedback about what they are doing that we want to encourage them to do again, we are teaching them to be helpful. Try using the basic formula: "You (describe what the child did) so (describe how it contributed to others). That was helpful." For example, "You picked up the blocks when I asked you to so no one would trip on them. That was helpful." As with any other skill, children learn kindness and helpfulness by practice and doing, as well as by seeing it modeled.



Practice Drawing and Writing this Holiday Season

There are lots of chances to encourage early literacy and fine motor skills this time of year as children make ornaments, cards, wish lists, letters to Santa, thank you notes after the holidays, etc. Using scissors, gluesticks or bottles, stickers, hole punches, and a variety of writing tools (pens, pencils, crayons, markers) all strengthen hand and finger muscles.

The picture below shows the stages children go through as they begin to differentiate drawing and writing, from about ages 12-18 months to around age 5.
