It's Kindergarten Registration Time!

Kindergarten Registration is open now for families who will be sending their children to the Jefferson City Public Schools. Children must be 5 years old before August 1, 2018 to attend kindergarten. If you plan to homeschool your child or they will be attending a parochial school, please let your parent educator know.

Online forms can be completed two ways:

- 1. On your own. Go to JCSchools.us>Quick Links>Kindergarten Registration. After submitting the online forms, you will receive an email to schedule an appointment to bring in the *required documents.
- 2. At the JCPS Welcome Center. Go to 315 E. Dunklin St. with the *required documents. Use their computers to submit the online forms (paper packets also available).
- *Required Documents for Kindergarten Registration:
- -Parent/guardian photo ID
- -Child's birth certificate (state-issued original)
- -Immunization records
- -Two forms of Proof of Residency dated in the last 45 days, such as: utility bill, cable/satellite bill, land line phone bill, housing contract/lease, paycheck stub or DFS/Social Services documents showing the parent's name and address.

Information regarding kindergarten open house this spring will be provided during your appointment at the Welcome Center. Students need to be enrolled BEFORE attending open

house at the schools. Registration will NOT take place during open house.

Children entering Kindergarten are also eligible to attend summer school. The theme will be "Camp Kindergarten - Time to explore school on a camping adventure!" This will be a great opportunity for your child to become familiar with the school routine and meet new friends. Summer school enrollment is open until April 4. Summer school will be held at the elementary buildings from 7:30am - 3:30pm, from Tuesday, May 29 through Thursday, June 21. The first week will run Tuesday-Friday and the subsequent weeks will run Monday-Thursday.
