Thanks to a Community Support Grant from the United Way of Central Missouri, the Jefferson City Public Schools Foundation was able to purchase new audiometers for some of the JCPS elementary buildings and an OAE hearing screener for the Southwest Early Childhood Center.

If you are the parent of a soon-to-be kindergartner please follow this link to access JCPS kindergarten registration information: <u>https://www.jcschools.us/Page/10047</u> Please note that after completing the online portion of registration, you will receive an email letting you know how to schedule an appointment at the Welcome Center to bring in required paperwork. Online registration can also be completed on a computer at the Welcome Center if you are unable to do it at home.

If your child will be attending parochial school or kindergarten in a district other than JCPS, you plan to homeschool, or you plan to wait a year before kindergarten, please let your parent educator know.

Families whose children attend the JCPS Preschool program (including Callaway Hills classroom) or receive services through Early Childhood Special Education will have the opportunity to meet with Welcome Center staff at Southwest on spring Parent-Teacher Conference days. If your child attends Southwest and you need assistance to complete online registration, contact our social worker Lisa Dierking at 659-3067 to set a time to use a computer at school.

There are perks to registering early! These include being able to attend a special kindergarten open house in early May for kindergarten screening and a chance to see the school, meet the

principal and kindergarten teachers, and see the kindergarten classrooms. You will also have the opportunity to enroll your child in summer school (May 28-June 20) when you complete your appointment at the Welcome Center.

ARE YOU ONE YEAR AWAY FROM KINDERGARTEN AND THINKING ABOUT PRESCHOOL?

The Jefferson City Public Schools offers a free preschool program for children the year before they enter kindergarten (so they would need to be 4 before August 1st to attend in the fall). There are both full day and half day options at the Southwest Early Childhood Center and a full day classroom at Callaway Hills for families who reside in Callaway county. There is no busing provided for this program; parents are responsible for transportation. All families whose children attend the JCPS preschool program participate in home visits through Parents as Teachers.

For the 2019-2020 school year, families must meet Free/Reduced lunch guidelines to qualify for preschool. The program also includes a screening process to assess academic need. Screening will be held May 13-16. To register your child for a screening appointment, you may call the Southwest Early Childhood Center office at 659-3026 beginning on April 1.

CONSCIOUS DISCIPLINE® SKILL OF THE MONTH: POSITIVE INTENT



Dr. Becky Bailey says the ultimate lesson from the Power of Love and Skill of Positive Intent is that "children cannot act differently until they are seen differently." That means that we as adults need to shift our thinking to focus on the why behind the behavior so we can teach children the skills they need rather than punish them for not having the skills yet. The "magic words" that can help us to do that are "YOU WANTED." For example:

Step 1 - Positive intent: "Noah, you wanted Angie to know you felt angry."

- Step 2 Notice: "So you hit her."
- Step 3 State the missing skill: "You didn't know what else to do."
- Step 4 Set limits: "You may not hit. Hitting hurts. It is not safe.
- Step 5 Teach: "When you want to let someone know you felt angry, say, I don't like it when you _____. Next time say _____."

Step 6 – Encourage: "You did it! You shared with Noah how you wanted her to treat you and she shared with you how she wanted to be treated."
