Curriculum Corner

COMMUNICATION ARTS - students can read and comprehend mystery fiction books on their independent reading level; define basic elements of a poem's structure; use text evidence to discuss a poem; make inferences about figurative language; analyze a poem; identify rhyme schemes in poetry; summarize a poem's message; write poetry

MATH - students can find fractions of a set with arrays; interpret fractions as division to find fractions of a set; multiply a whole number by a fraction

SCIENCE - students can describe structures of the geosphere, biosphere, hydrosphere, and atmosphere; describe how the systems interact with each other; make a model of earth's movements; identify and describe the layers of the earth

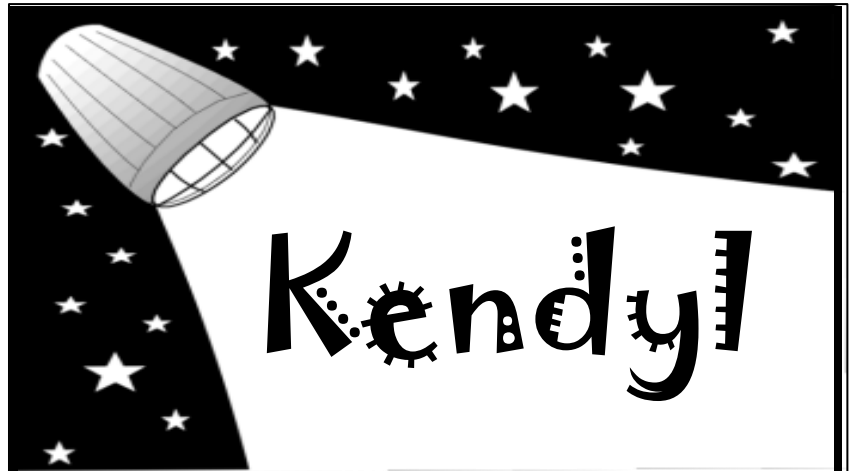
SOCIAL STUDIES - Students can explain the causes of the Civil War and describe the effects of Reconstruction
