What Do We Need?

- ✓ Paper
- ✓ Glue sticks
- Old butter tub to hold some "White School Glue" and a glue "brush" which can be a popsicle stick or Q-Tip to help apply the glue to the objects
- ✓ Variety of collage
 materials: cotton balls,
 pom poms, paper scraps,
 stickers, pasta noodles,
 old silk flowers, leaves,
 glitter, spare photos,
 wiggly eyes, ribbon,
 yarn, feathers, etc.
- √ Plastic cover for table
