Reading/Writing: In addition to working on iReady testing this week, I hope to do a better job at getting students to complete the rough drafts of their informational papers on Native Americans in order to begin typing and adding images with captions and a reference page. Our reading



lessons last week covered the 5 types of nonfiction text structures, so this week we'll work on determining author's purpose, identifying main idea, and growing our thinking through nonfiction.

Math: After taking the Unit 5 test over *Dividing Decimals* and the mid-year assessment in iReady, we start our new unit on adding and subtracting *Fractions*. You may remember from Parent/Teacher conferences in October that I mentioned a large portion of the 5th grade report card standards focus on fractions.
