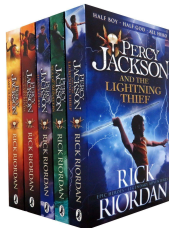

What's going on in our classroom this week?

Ask your student about our **Growth Mindset lessons:** We're trying to have positive attitudes about what our abilities are to learn and "grow our minds."

Reading/Writing: Students will be organizing their Native American informational piece into paragraphs with a solid main idea and supporting detail sentences. We will work to include an engaging introduction, as well as, a memorable conclusion. We are also listening to some interesting biographies & trying to use context clue strategies for determining definitions of unfamiliar words within an informational text.

Math: We will work on lessons this week to divide decimals by a whole number and divide decimals by another decimal. The trick is really about using what we know to determine where the decimal point should be located in the final quotient.

Social Studies: We are enjoying our discovery of "The Age of Exploration," reading and discussing Europeans coming to the Americas, the Aztecs, and the
