
What's going on in our classroom this week?

2nd Steps Lesson: Emotion Management (Stop, Name the Feeling, Calm Down)

Reading: This week our focus is on determining point-of-view, using context clues to unlock the meaning of difficult words, and discovering how an author can make foreshadowing/flashbacks work. We are completing several lessons on punctuation: how it changes meaning, when to use commas, and understanding what's needed for showing dialogue. Students will begin publishing his/her memoir with the proper punctuation and create cover page artwork. An assessment over fictional reading/writing will occur later this week and into next.

Math: We will take the Unit 3-Division of Whole Numbers test on Monday/Tuesday, then we will begin concentrating on <u>multiplication of decimals</u> starting with finding patterns & multiplying a decimal by a whole number.

Science: Students reviewed for the first unit test by going over the study guide & by playing a game of Kahoot! "States of Matter" test is Tuesday. Our next unit will be over "Layers of the Atmosphere."



Social Studies: Last Friday we wrote letters and colored pictures that were distributed at Hy-Vee's Veteran Day breakfast. This week I hope to begin our initial discussion about a few Native American groups: Hopi & Woodlands/Iroquois.
