


Shout Outs & Reminders

- 2nd Steps: This year, Lawson is teaching a set of social skills lessons each Monday morning. The 2nd Steps series helps to promote social awareness, as well as academic success at each grade level. We are currently on Lesson 6: Accepting Differences. Each lesson contains short videos centered around different issues that come up in a school setting and provides discussion questions to get us talking about how to handle these responsibly & respectfully. You may want to ask your child what they remember from his/her "2nd Steps" lesson each week; it could generate some good conversation at home, too.

What's going on in our classroom this week?

Reading/Writing: We will practice the **RACE** strategy (restate, answer, cite, & evidence) when trying to provide text evidence to support conclusions and inferences. We will also work on determining theme, as well as analyzing characters. We are drafting our personal narratives this week, trying to keep our audience/purpose in mind, while including transitional words & phrases. Students will also begin working on the digital platform with *Words Their Way* for spelling. (*Trust me when I tell you, there's going to be quite a learning curve for their teacher.*)

Math: We start Unit 3 over Division of Whole Numbers.

We will use a popular strategy called the "grid/box method" which really seems to help students feeling a bit overwhelmed by division. We will divide by single digit and 2-digit divisors this week.

Science: We will continue to focus our studies on the *States of Matter*. We performed some experiments last week exploring the concepts of measuring mass & volume. This week we will model the particles of matter, discussing how they are structured & organized.
