What's going on in our classroom this week?

English Language Arts: We will complete several interactive read-alouds with mentor author texts; these books will demonstrate how to add dialogue, descriptions, and storytelling qualities to our own writing pieces. Our guided reading groups are also getting under way with a strong focus toward questioning while we read and determining character motivation. In reading, we will examine the different forms of conflict, plot structure, and tracking of time used in fiction.

Math: Last week we got the hang of using the vocabulary of base and exponents, so we could show the value of a number as a whole number multiplied by the correct power of ten. This week we will take a mid-chapter check point and continue with lessons over multiplying by 2-digit numbers before covering the topic of *order of operations* (PEMDAS).

Social Studies: We finished our last Western region quiz on Friday. Monday & Tuesday of this week we will prepare for the **final** 50-states and optional capitals **test on Wednesday**. Be sure to ask your student how we used Kahoot! to review.
