<p><u>Create Connections</u></p> <p>Make a connection to 3 new vocabulary words from your independent reading. A connection is a memory, experience, story, song, etc. that each word reminds you of.</p>	<p><u>Riddle Me This</u></p> <p>Write riddles for 2 challenging vocabulary words from your book. Use the definition of the words as a source of clues in the riddles. (Be sure to include an answer key)</p>	<p><u>Same & Opposite</u></p> <p>Choose 3 new vocabulary words from your independent reading. Write a synonym & an antonym for each word.</p>
<p><u>Acrostic</u></p> <p>Write acrostic poems for 2 difficult vocabulary words from your book. Remember in an acrostic poem, the vocab word will run vertically & each letter of the vocab word starts a different word that relates back to it in some way.</p>	<p><u>Quiz Whiz</u></p> <p>Create quiz questions to test someone else's knowledge of 3 interesting vocabulary words from your independent reading. (Be sure to include an answer key)</p>	<p><u>Sort It</u></p> <p>Choose 5 challenging vocabulary words from your book & sort them into 2 Categories. The more creative the categories the better! Words can be sorted by meaning, number of letters, vowels, etc.</p>
<p><u>Super Sentences</u></p> <p>Write 1 sentence using 3 new or interesting vocabulary words from your reading. Show you know the meaning of the words by how you use them in the sentence.</p>	<p><u>Handle the Scramble</u></p> <p>Scramble the letters of 3 interesting words from your reading. Then create a clue for each vocabulary word to help someone guess the answer. (Be sure to include an answer key)</p>	<p><u>In Your Own Words</u></p> <p>Choose 3 difficult vocabulary words from your reading and write their definitions in your own words.</p>
