Eligibility

With final recommendations coming from the academic departments, all scholarship recipients must meet the following minimum qualifications. Scholarships will be awarded on a competitive basis.

Internships

One-semester Jefferson city-based internship scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 are available for the following courses:

One-semester out-of-state internship scholarships in the amount of \$5,000 are available.

Students receiving the Viola M. Smith Young Scholarship for the major are not eligible to receive the scholarship if they are awarded the \$5,000 out-of-state internship scholarship for study in the U.S. or abroad.

Students receiving the Viola M. Smith Young Scholarship for the major are not eligible for the one-semester field study award.

Scholarships Available

Undergraduate

- Up to ten (10) four-year scholarships for incoming freshmen and continuing students majoring in History or Political Science.
- Scholarships approximately \$6,000 per year.
- Scholarships are renewable for up to eight (8) semesters.
- Students must maintain a minimum 3.25 cumulative GPA and be in good standing with the university.
- Students who meet the requirements but who have other sources of funds may apply for a partial scholarship of <u>up to</u>\$1,500.
- FAFSA not required

Undergraduate Minor

- Up to ten (10) four year scholarships for incoming freshmen and continuing students minoring in History or Political Science.
- Scholarships approximately \$1,000 per year.

Graduate

- Up to six (6) graduate scholarships of <u>up to</u> \$4.500 each are available.
- Three (3) scholarships to students enrolled in the M.B.A. program with Public Administration emphasis.
- Three (3) scholarships to students enrolled in the Master of History.

Viola M. Smith Young was a lifelong resident of Mid-Missouri and actively involved in various historical societies. She married Roger Smith in 1945.

After attending several institutions of higher education, Roger Smith graduated from Lincoln University with a B.S. Degree in Education. Following military service, Mr. Smith became Superintendent of Schools for Cole County until 1943. He was reelected to the office in 1959 and served until his retirement in 1967.

In recognition of Lincoln University's long history of service and benefits provided to Mid-Missouri and as Roger Smith's alma mater, Viola M. Smith Young chose to endow the Viola M. Smith Young Scholarship.
