How we gathered information

Inputs:

- December Faculty Council members gathered feedback from their buildings and discussed (survey)
- Elementary Principal meeting
- Secondary Principal meeting
- Professional Development Committee provided inputs (survey)
- Principals gathered additional feedback from their buildings
- Panorama Survey
- > Rounding



Staff Priorities based on the feedback

- Staff priorities (from surveys and confirmed with conversations)
- 2 full weeks at Christmas
- Last day of school before Memorial Day
- First week start on Wednesday or Thursday
- > 3 full days at Thanksgiving
- ➢ Full week of spring break

Based on this feedback coupled with state requirements, we (Jason) put calendar options together and Round 2 of the input process began.

We would like to share with you what we learned through collaborative problem-solving.



Feedback Process

Inclusive and collaborative process for input - District

- Commitment to getting feedback from a variety of groups through a variety of mechanisms. Everyone looks at the calendar from their lens so all voices need to be heard and considered
- Through ACDC, principals were given the opportunity to collaborate on the pros and cons of calendar options & hear different perspectives
- Principals were given the opportunity to seek specific feedback from their buildings & bring that feedback to ACDC to discuss and provide recommendations that best meet the needs of our district.



Feedback Process

Inclusive and collaborative process - Building level

- Grade level team meetings provide us an opportunity to listen to feedback and identify our building needs
- Key piece of feedback we received was the need for time so we can engage in professional development, collaboration, and purposeful planning.
- We are seeing the benefits of collaboration and feel we make great gains with additional professional development time. When we have time to learn new strategies and monitor student process, our students benefit!

Why do we need PD?

Effective professional development is ongoing and includes:

- contact hours,
- duration and
- coherence.



How do we plan for PD?

> PD at beginning of year and throughout

- Begin introducing important topics and areas of focus
- Ongoing to adjust and refine based on assessment results
- Monitor implementation and adjust as needed
- Observe and collaborate leading to best practice implementation



Early releases

Early releases are important because they do not take away from \succ student learning days When students are in school, our focus is on them How early release time is used at the elementary level: Y Vertical teaming across grade levels Collaboration on and plan around PD Additional time to focus on ever-changing needs of our students



Early releases

- Our building goals are focused on building community and improving instruction.
 - Frequent and ongoing professional development time allows for increased collaboration and training to help us meet our goals
- The data at Thomas Jefferson is trending up in our focus areas and we attribute it to our professional development and collaboration structure. We are seeing progress and are advocates for our professional development time.



Early releases - Special Education

Rachel Gulick, Lewis and Clark (Faculty Council)

- Our focus is on students when school is in session
- We utilize our PD time to learn and grow so that we can best meet our students' needs
 - This includes collaboration about students' learning goals and needs
 - Differentiated instruction needs to be a collaborative effort that we can all learn from. The gift of time would allow us to do this.



Considerations and Next Steps

- Additional time to support professional development, collaboration, and planning; this could be done through weekly 70 minute early releases
 - Through input and collaboration, consensus was frequent & ongoing would be most effective
 - All-day PD days takes away student learning days\
- As we plan for the 2021-22 school year, our District strategic plan, building improvement plans, and staff growth plans will drive the content and structure for our early release time
- Building autonomy given the resources and time to meet our district goals to enhance student outcomes
- > Next Steps
 - Gather resource options to assist families with planning for the early releases
 - Community partnerships
 - Ways to use our existing staff
