# Where is my kiddo and what is he/she doing?

Encore (6th and 7th Hour)	2:11 - 2:59 3:02 - 3:50	Students report to classes such as PE, Fine Arts, Health, FACS, EER, Supplemental Studies and Technology classes.
Dismissal	3:50 pm	Students return to their lockers and homerooms. Students are required to check out with their homeroom teacher at the end of the day and are walked downstairs by teachers. Bus riders to the front and car riders to the back.

- Try to schedule appointments after school or before school. Anytime out of school is counted against your student.
- If your student is tardy or has an appointment, remember that you must escort the student in or out of the building, signing in or out at the attendance window. After 8:50 am, the front doors are locked and you must be buzzed in to access the school. You will be asked to provide a photo id for safety reasons.

# How do I know if my kid is falling behind on homework?

\*\*Register for the parent portal in Infinite Campus.\*\* This will show whether or not things have been turned in and eventually their score. It will also show your student's progress towards our learning targets.

If you do not have computer access, call during team time 2:15 - 3:00 pm and we will be able to assist you during that time.

#### **CELL PHONE USAGE:**

New Cell Phone Policy: Pre-8 Cell Phones and Personal Electronic Devices:

It is strongly recommended that students and parents carefully weigh the choice of whether or not to bring personal cell phones, music players, cameras, and other electronic devices to school. These items can be disruptive to the learning environment, often create discipline problems, and are frequently damaged, lost, or stolen. Parents are reminded that in case of an emergency, the main office is the appropriate point of contact to ensure that your child is quickly reached and assisted. If students do bring cell phones and/or other electronic devices to school, they will need to be turned off during the school day and stored in their backpacks. Students who bring cell phones or other devices to school are responsible for the safety and security of those devices. Headphones or earbuds will need to be stored securely and should not be worn during school unless the teacher has approved an activity that requires listening on chrome books or school provided media. The school accepts no responsibility for cell phones or other electronic devices that are lost, damaged, or stolen at school or while traveling to and from school. Cell phones and personal electronic devices will not be used during any part of the school day, therefore, should not be visible during the school day.

Cell Phone staff procedure: Step 1 = Remind to put away; Step 2 = (if have it out again) Give following choice: (A)Put away in backpack OR (B)Put away in office vault; Step 3 = Refusal or Disrespect will be an Office Discipline Referral (ODR)

### What happens if my kid is sick or will be absent for an extended period of time?

Please notify the office and we can arrange to make a homework packet for your student to be picked up by 4:00 pm. Students can access the Google Classroom for each class that they miss. If your child is sick during the day, they **must check in with the nurse** to be assessed and she will contact you. **Students who contact a parent (home) outside of this procedure may receive consequences.** 

#### **Dress code:**

# Some things of Note:

- a) Hats, hoods, do-rags (headcovers), shower caps and bandanas are not permitted (religious exceptions)
- b) No pajamas/pajama pants to be worn.
- c) No slippers to be worn.
- d) No midriffs or crop tops. Bellies should not be exposed.

### Some helpful Dress code tips:

We have little control over the climate in the classrooms and it can be **FREEZING or SWELTERING** room-by-room. Our suggestion is to wear layers. We remind students to keep chins to knees covered and practice good personal hygiene. Ladies, in particular, please be advised that shorts and skirts that go shorter than mid-thigh may be subject to making a phone call home. Remember, we walk up a tall staircase to our classrooms.

PE does not have lockers, so dress appropriately for PE days this means shoes too!.

- \*\*Only water filling stations are available! Please send your student with a water bottle daily. All water bottles must have a spill-proof lid that seals and should contain water only.
- \*\* No LOCKERS- Students bring all belongings with them all day long.
- \*\*No blankets or pillows from home
